This notice is to inform customers of the Tavistock Sewage Collection System, and any other interested local residents, property owners and agencies, that Oxford County (County) is nearing completion of the above-noted study and is at the stage now where it wishes to consult with the directly affected members of the public before any final decisions are made in respect of the project.

The Tavistock Sewage Collection System Municipal Class EA project has been conducted in accordance with the Schedule 'B' requirements of the Municipal Class Environmental Assessment, to review and evaluate the sewage collection system in an effort to minimize current and future surcharging.

In order to inform customers and to obtain public input on the County's progress on the Municipal Class EA, a Public Information Centre will be held at the Tavistock & District Recreation Centre, 3 Adam Street (Memorial Hall) on Tuesday, February 3, 2009 from 7:00 p.m. - 8:30 p.m. (with a presentation scheduled at 7:30 p.m.).

Staff from the County and R.J. Burnside & Associates Limited, the Consulting Engineers retained by the County for this project, will be in attendance at the Public Information Centre to present project information and to answer any questions.

When the project is finalized, a report will be prepared and a Notice of Completion will also be published, advising of a formal 30-day public and agency review period to comment on this project.
